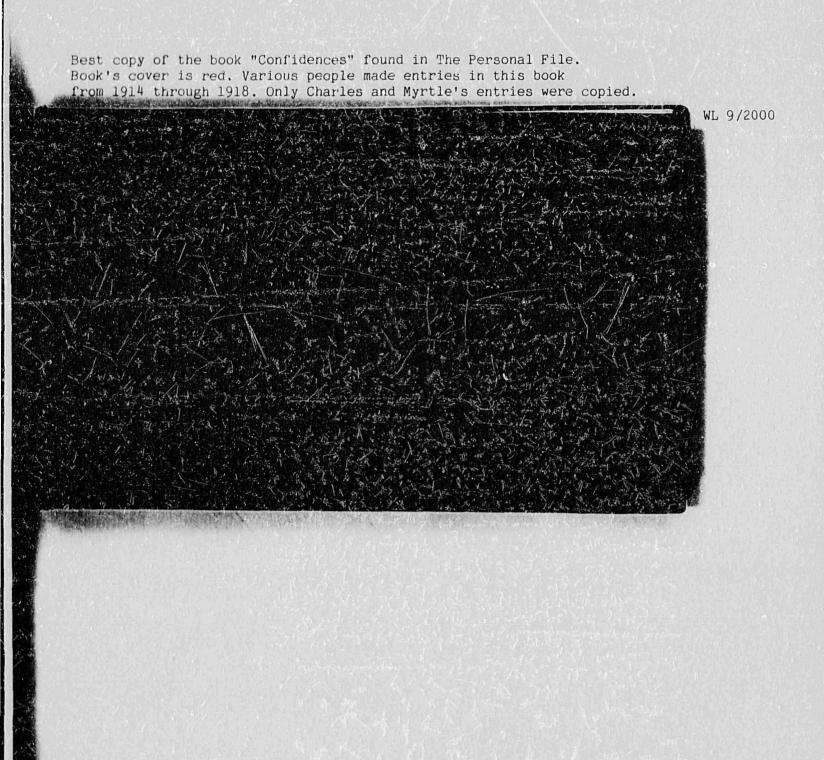
AUTOGRAPH BOOK WITH ENTRIES 1914-1918

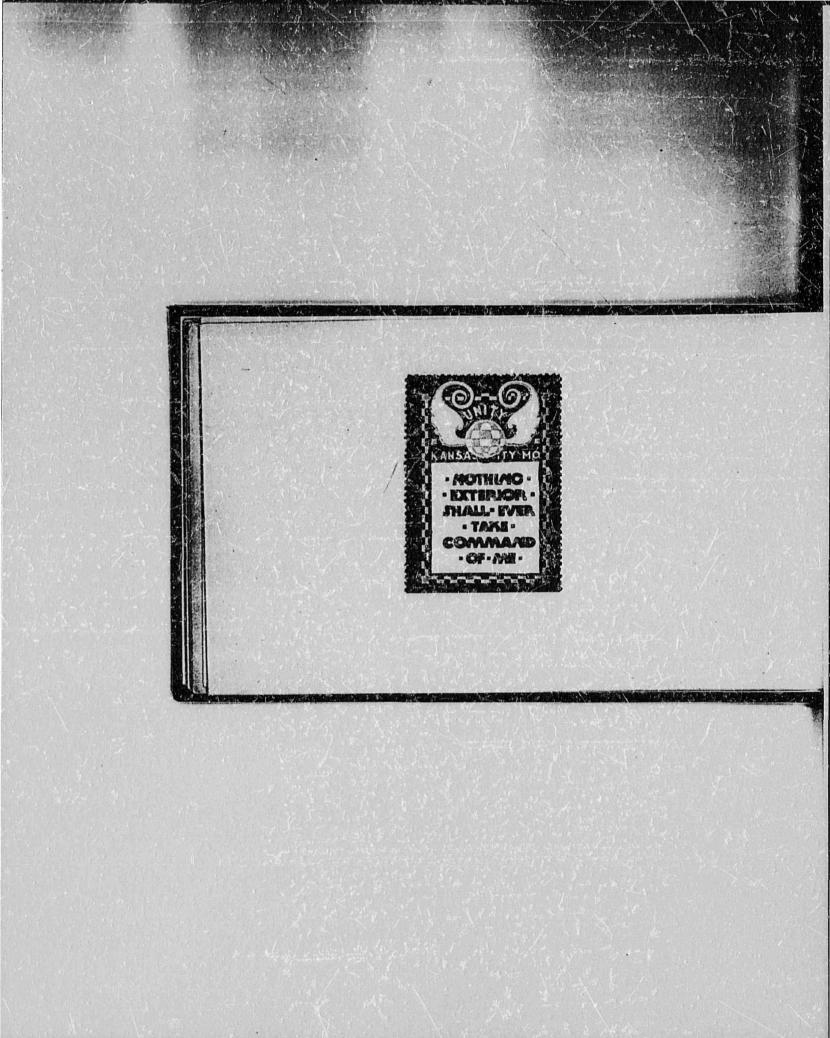
