

THIS MONTH'S FEATURED TOPIC

Music, it is said, is a universal language. It connects us heart to heart and soul to soul when beliefs and words threaten to divide us. It is the medium through which we are able to not only know that we are

connected to God but to feel this Truth as well.

Music, speaks to us of turmoil, peace, risk, joy, sadness, softness and so on. It can transport us to a magical place within or help us to burn off the lies that we tell about ourselves. Music is healing, music is empowering, music is connecting; it is indeed a universal language.

Those of us who work in youth and family ministry know the importance of using music to not only help to created a safe and sacred environment but also to help us connect with one another. We connect through the feeling of the melody and through the lyrics that often tell powerful stories that we can all relate to.

No matter the genre, music tells us stories that invite us to consider new ideas, help us to know that we are not alone on the journey and invite us into healing.

In youth and family ministry we use music in a variety of ways...

To Create an Environment

- Having age appropriate, engaging music playing as the children and teens enter the room helps to create a sense of sacred space and lets them know that we have been expecting them. It sends the message that we are glad that they are here!
 A Few Examples:
- A Child's Spirit, by Bunny Hull
- Unite With Me in Song, Unity of Clearwater

To Connect

• Choosing music that has the feeling and intent of the lesson experience will invite the children and teens to connect to that intention the moment they step through the door

For Transitions

• For young children it is especially important to have transitions between the different parts of the lesson. The music is a signal to complete the current activity and prepare to move into the next adventure.

A Few Examples:

- Come Join the Circle; LessonSongs for Peacemaking, by Paulette Meier
- Brain Boogie Boosters, (Brain hemisphere connecting songs), The Learning Station & Dr. Becky Bailey

To Tell a Story

- Contemporary songs that tell a story can be used as the main focus of the lesson. Once the song is played, the students can be invited into a discussion that leads to deeper personal exploration.
- An Example:
- Storm, by Lifehouse
 - This song speaks of feeling as if one is caught in a storm; feeling lost and looking for their love. When the students are invited to think of God as the focus of their love, then the song takes on a deeper, personal meaning, similar to the story of Jesus Calming the Storm.

To Illustrate a Truth Principle

- Songs that again, take the listener on a journey can be used to illustrate Truth principles in action.
- An Example:
- Music Video: *If Everyone Cared,* by Nickelback
 - This song and music video illustrate the power that one person has to make a difference. It is very inspiring and can lead to discussions about how each person in the group can make a difference by boldly stepping out into their own genius.

For Prayer & Meditation

• Playing meditative music will help give the children and teens something to focus on as they learn the skill of meditation. There are unlimited choices of this type of music.

To Link Generations

• Creating intergenerational events using music is way to bridge the gap between the generations.

An Example:

- Beads on One String, by Dennis Warner
 - Dennis has created not only a wonderful song that speaks to everyone but also a book and activity that encourages people of all ages to come together to celebrate both their individuality and their common ground.

To Encourage Skill Development

• There is a wonderful program within Musikgarten that offers music, movement and stories to help our youngest children learn more about themselves and their world.

Program:

• God's Children Sing Program, from Musikgarten, www.musikgarten.org

To inspire

- Our regional and national Uniteen and Y.O.U. events almost always have a music component in them. The music is both sacred and appeals to this age group. Musicians, just to name a few:
- Leroy
- Mark Welch
- Mark Anthony

This is just a very brief description of all of the ways that music can be used to enhance the programs we offer to our children and teens. I am sure there are many more resources that are available and many yet to be discovered. Wouldn't it be wonderful if there could be a

team of musicians and spiritual educators who would be willing to come together to compile a list of resources; to create new ones and to help bring music more fully into our programs?

I know I would be willing to be a part of it. How about you?

WHAT'S A NEW THOUGHT SONG

HERE I AM LORD – Dan Schutte, S.J. c. 1981 North American Liturgy Resources

I, the Lord of sea and sky, I have heard my people cry. All who dwell dark and sin, My hand will save. I who made the stars of night, I will make their darkness bright. Who will bear my light to them? Whom shall I send?

CHORUS: Here I am Lord. Is it I Lord? I have heard You calling in the night. I will go Lord, if you lead me. I will hold Your people in my heart.

I the Lord of snow and rain, I have borne My people's pain. I have wept for love of them. They turn away. I will break their hearts of stone, give them hearts for love alone. I will speak my word to them. Whom shall I send?

I, the Lord of wind and flame, I will tend the poor and lame. I will set a feast for them. My hand will save. Finest bread I will provide till their hearts be satisfied. I will give My life to them. Whom shall I send?

We have gotten into the habit of changing lyrics to existing songs so that we can use them in our services. In this frenzy to create music we can use, I feel we became a little too liberal in our "poetic license", changing and updating words that were not necessarily conflicting with our beliefs but just because we happen to like a word better.

Dan Shcutte's "Here I Am Lord" is used in many of our churches for chaplaincy training or for honoring our volunteers. There are just a couple subtle changes that could be made to this song to make it compatible for NT use.

For example, the line, "All who dwell in dark and sin" is updated to "All who dwell in loneliness" because of our beliefs around sin and its meaning.

Changing the chorus lines, "Is it I Lord?" to "It is I Lord!" is definitely more empowering in the context we use the song. (When I recorded this song on my "God Is!" CD I used, "Is it I?" the first chorus, then "It is I" there after.) And changing "I will go Lord, <u>if</u> you lead me" to "I will go Lord <u>where</u> you lead me" affirms our belief that God is always leading us – that there is never an "if" in God mind. These changes are subtle sometimes even imperceptible to the listener.

The rest of the lyrics in the verses are beautifully written, poetic, scriptural and have no conflict with our belief system. They should be left intact. I've seen so many flowering, "airy fairy", unitized changes that are not necessary. If you are going to change the words that extensively, just write a new song!

THE PEACE SONG: UPDATED LYRICS, COPYRIGHT AND HISTORY

Hi Richard-

I'm a licensed Unity teacher currently serving as spiritual leader of a church. When I was at the Village for classes, one of our instructors told us (as part of planning our graduation) that it would be good to transition away from the traditional use of the Peace song at the end of each service- unless we were singing it as written (God as Father, Brothers all are we, solemn vow, etc). Additionally, it sounded as though the copyright-holders of the Peace song are not thrilled that New Thought churches have adopted the song as our beliefs are not in alignment with theirs. To me- this was a wonderful and exciting opportunity to revamp a part of the service that has always felt a bit rote and awkward, what with folks all singing different words depending on how they know the song. So-- ta dah!-- I came home, explained to my Board, got their approval to make the change to start singing a variety of peace-themed songs, and began the transition. I explained our change to the congregation, and for the most part- everyone seems to be quite alright with this change.

Occasionally though, we get these spurts of "who says?", "who's going to know, anyway?", and "are we sure that we really shouldn't be singing it?". I admit to being biased in the direction of letting it go- personally, I love the freedom of using Karen Drucker's "Stand" or Fred Bogert's "One Voice", your own "A World Awakening" or other artists' songs- there are SO many true New Thought artists to choose from.

For me (and for most of the folks in my congregation who've been in on this discussion) the central issue is, IF it is true that the copyright-owners of the song really do not want this song used in New Thought churches - regardless of legal standing- then our teaching of non-resistance alone should prohibit us from using the song. How can we claim an intention of peace while using a song that the rightful owners have said they do not want us to use?

Thanks so much for listening, and any input you have will be most appreciated! Thanks as well for all of your work promoting positive New Thought music. I'm not a musician, but I love to sing and I love to listen to positive music and I think that it is a great, great tool for us to add as we spread the Unity message.

Thanks for your note Nita. I'd be happy to clear this up.

It was an ongoing issue in Sound Connections way back in Sept - November of 2006 (Issues 18-20 or so). I was able to talk directly to the daughter of the authors (Jan Tache') who now administers JanLee Music. She said her and her parents are grateful and honored that our churches use "Let There Be Peace On Earth" and she was very agreeable and understanding to our desire to update the gender references. After some discussion it was agreed (and they even put the acceptable updated lyrics on their website) that changing it to; "God as Creator, family all are we, let us walk with each other in perfect harmony." would be acceptable.

She was less agreeable though to the change of "solemn" to" joyous" vow. This seemed like "change just for change sake" to her. I agreed, it is simply a "touchy-feely" change and does not really add to or update the meaning.

She was also opposed to some churches completely turning the lyrics around to say "Now there is peace on earth and it has begun with me." etc. . . . (In fact a letter going out to all our churches suggesting everyone adopt this lyric shift, is what got the attention of Jan Lee Music and started this whole discussion.)

In Jan's words, "Philosophically, apart from the copyright considerations, I believe that the creation of peace in one's own life is an ongoing process and that the song doesn't discuss whether there is or is not peace already. It simply affirms one's own commitment to creating peace in every moment. I believe that that is where we human beings have the greatest power-in the present moment, in our own lives."

I also agreed with her on this one too. After all, God brought forth the entire Universe with those words – "Let there be . . . "

The song has been a beloved part of our services for many decades now and some churches feel it is time for a change just for that reason, but certainly not because the authors don't want "new thought" churches using it.

Again, in Jan's own words, "We have a very long and happy relationship with Unity; I was raised going to Unity Sunday School and came to Lee's Summit for the Youth of Unity Conference one summer years ago." (Issue 18 of Sound Connections) So let's quell that false rumor right away. Hope that helps. R P.S. If you are still considering changing the ending song of your service, there is Daniel Nahmod's "Love Is My Decision" and Rickie Byar's "Blessed Always" as well.

LIVE STREAMING MAINSTREAM MUSIC

Hey Todd,

I met today with First Unity in St Pete's new director, Jeff! . . . He has a copyright question which I didn't know the answer to. They are going to get the (EmPower) Music Rights license, since they are doing primarily NT music now. But, occasionally they perform a pop song like something by Carole King, or Josh Grobin. Where would they get the license to have that song archived on their site or streamed via their podcast?

Dear Sue,

ASCAP and BMI refer all church licensees to Christian Copyright Solutions (CCS) at <u>www.copyrightsolver.com</u>. CCS offers a webcast license (they call it a Worshipcast license) which covers all ASCAP, BMI and SESAC songs for live streaming, podcasting, online streaming, archived audio and internet radio.

The cost is dependent on the size of the church and reporting must be done weekly or monthly online.

Harry Fox Agency (at <u>www.Harryfox.com</u>) does NOT handle webcasting licensing. They handle mechanical licensing for manufacturing CDs and digital downloads (such as on i-tunes or Rhapsody).
